2 Our school Motto, Vision, Mission, and Values guide all that we do in CTSS and represent what we would like your child/ward (or 'Clementeen') to become by the time he/she graduates. Our desired outcomes are for all Clementeens to be anchored in the ASPIRE values; have a positive attitude towards lifelong learning; and care for one another as well as others in the community. Our Clementeens do best when we work hand in hand. Hence, I seek your support to partner with my teachers.

Sec 3 Meet-the-Parents Session (10 January 2025)

3 I warmly invite you to attend the Sec 3 Meet-the-Parents session on Friday 10 January 2025, from 6.00p.m. to 7.30p.m. in the school hall. This is part of our effort to enhance communication and partnership with you. More information regarding the Meet-the-Parents session will be put up on Parent Gateway.

4 The programme comprises Vice-Principal's and Assistant Year Head's address, ECG sharing and Question & Answer, followed by breakout sessions with Sec 3 Class Parents (form teachers).

Class Parents – Caring and Growing Our Clementeens

5 As we continue to enhance our CCA-House model, strengthening students' experiences and providing greater social and emotional support for our students, form classes for Sec 3 will be re-organised according to students' interest and choice of subjects. Your child will have the opportunity to interact with new classmates and will have two Class Parents (CPs) to oversee his/her well-being and development besides the CCAPs who will continue to exercise the duty of care for your child/ward during CCA sessions. As mentioned above, you will have the opportunity to meet your child/ward's CPs at the upcoming Secondary 3 Meet-the-Parents Session.

School Hours, Policies on Attendance and Use of Personal Electronic Devices (PED)

6 We would like to emphasise the importance of regular school attendance, which is strongly correlated to student engagement and achievement. If your child/ward must miss school due to medical reasons, please ensure that his/her absence is supported by a Medical Certificate (MC). For other absences from school not supported by medical reasons, please note that the school will only accept a maximum of two letters of excuse from parents/guardians, per term. A valid reason should be provided. Additionally, please ensure that if you have any holiday plans to schedule it only after school closure.

7 If your child/ward is not in school by 8.00a.m. each school day, an SMS notification will be sent to one of the parents/guardian at 8.30a.m. This is to keep you informed of your child/ward's daily attendance. Please note that only the parent/guardian listed as the "Primary Person to Contact" will be notified by SMS when your child/ward is not in school.

Use of personal electronic devices (PEDs) such as mobile phones and mobile game consoles are not allowed during curriculum hour. Clementeens are expected to have their mobile phones switched off or on silent mode and locked away in their allocated personal lockers before the start of the first lesson of the day. For activities outside curriculum hour such as CCA sessions, learning journeys, enrichment and academic support programmes, regulated use will be recommended by teachers. Mobile phones can only be used after curriculum hour at the PED zones – Foyer (includes in front Youth Club House), umbrella seats (in front of General Office) and the canteen. For students who do not abide by this rule, consequences may involve the confiscation of the mobile phones and parental engagement. If you need to contact your child/ward during curriculum hour, please call the school's General Office for assistance.

School Assessment Policy

9 Since 2023, the school had removed Mid-Year Examinations (MYE) for all levels in line with MOE's move to pace out teaching and learning and for students to have more space and time to develop 21st century competencies and experience greater joy in learning.

10 Students will receive feedback on their learning progress through in-class and take-home work as well as during lesson activities. Their understanding will then be assessed through a series of Weighted Assessments (WA), conducted over the course of the year before they sit for the summative assessment End-of-Year Examinations (EYE). Blended Learning & CTSS Self-Directed Learning Days

11 *CTSS Self-Directed Learning (SDL) Days:* SDL Days is a regular feature in our students' learning experiences, spanning:

- Terms 1 to 3 of a school year for Sec 1 to 3;
- Terms 1 and 2 for Sec 4 and 5.

SDL Days are scheduled on **Even Week Fridays**.

12 To prepare our students for their learning on SDL Days, **the first SDL Day will be held in school on Friday 17 January 2025, from 7.30a.m. to 12.40p.m**. Students will need to bring their writing materials, learning materials for the SDL-featured subjects, PLDs, Apple Pencils and personal earpieces. They will learn and apply learning strategies, study skills, time management, and self-regulating strategies such as goal setting, action planning, monitoring and evaluation of their progress.

13 From the second SDL day (Friday 31 January 2025) onwards, your child/ward need not report to school on SDL Days. He/She will exercise his learner agency in planning his learning schedule on these days which would include the subjects mentioned below. He/She is expected to complete the learning tasks and assignments via e-Learning portals. The instructions will be shared by the subject teachers with your child/ward through respective Google Classrooms and the Student Learning Space (SLS) on these days. The following subjects will make up the scope of students' academic learning on SDL Days.

14 Student-Initiated Learning (SIL): In addition to subject lessons, students are provided the time and space to actively explore their interests and passions, and learn within and beyond the curriculum. As such, SIL seeks to develop students' intrinsic motivation and nurture self-directed learning. To ensure students have agency and choice over what they want to learn, the school has curated a wide range of appropriate learning experiences and resources for students to choose from. The recommended duration for SIL is 1 hour on each SDL day.

16 Responsible Use of PLDs and Technology: Students should charge their PLDs and Apple Pencils and bring them daily to school. They are also expected to act in a responsible and appropriate manner when using technology for lessons and school-related activities. These actions may include loss of usage privileges for a period of time, supervised use of devices and confiscation of devices.

Secondary 3 Programmes in Term 1

Sec 3 New MOE DMA Installation (16 January 2025)

The new MOE Device Management Application (DMA), Jamf, will be deployed to your child's/ward's iPad Personal Learning Devices (PLD) on 16 January 2025. Students from Sec 2 to Sec 5 will be rostered to install the new MOE DMA during curriculum time.

As shared previously via Parents Gateway (PG), the iPad PLD will have to be reset as part of the deployment. Please inform your child/ward of the deployment date and remind him/her to back up the files before the deployment. If you have installed some other parental controls including the built-in parental controls on your child's/ward's iPad PLDs, please remove these controls before 16 January 2025.

Your child/ward may refer to the Singapore Student Learning Space (SLS) module for instructions on how to back up the files. Your child/ward has been informed of this module and given access to it from 25 October 2024 to 15 December 2024. The module "Digital Literacy and Technological Skills - File Management and Data Back-up [2024]" will be re-administered to your child/ward if your child/ward had not completed the module previously. Your child can access the module again from 29 December 2024.

All parents will receive a separate PG notification with more information on the Parent User Guides.

Chinese New Year Celebration (28 Jan 2025) and Annual Donation Drive

The school will be organising a Chinese New Year Celebration on Tuesday 28 January 2025. Students will be dismissed at 10.30a.m. on that day. Students do not need to report to school on Wednesday 29 January and Thursday 30 January 2025 as these two dates are CNY public holidays.

In the midst of celebration, we remember the underprivileged in our society. In inculcating the value of empathy in our Clementeens, the Mother Tongue Language (MTL) Department is holding the annual donation drive for St Andrew's Cathedral Home for the Aged. We seek your support to encourage your child/ward to contribute at least one item (e.g. canned food or daily necessities) by Friday 24 January 2025. Donations are voluntary. Details on the donation drive will also be posted on Parents Gateway.

Mother Tongue Language Fortnight Programme (3 February – 14 February 2025)

To develop students' understanding and interest towards their own culture, the MTL Department will be organising the Mother Tongue Language Fortnight Programme from 3 February to 14 February 2025. Details will be provided to students later.

Culinary Chef Experience (4 February 2025)

Our Sec 3 Nutrition and Food Science students will be attending a Culinary Chef Experience workshop on 4 February from 3.15p.m. to 5.45p.m. at our school Food Lab. Students will be exposed to a comprehensive culinary training and dining, which focuses on unique gourmet recipes with innovative cooking methods under the tutelage of an experienced Chef Trainer. In addition, the programme is also designed to instill discipline, ownership, and self-motivation in students.

Secondary 3 Outdoor Adventure Learning Camp (10 to 13 February 2025)

To provide an authentic context in which students can apply what they have learnt from Character and Citizenship Education (CCE) and Outdoor Education in Physical Education (OE in PE), the Secondary 3 students will be attending a 4-Day 3-Night Outdoor Adventure Learning (OAL) Residential Camp as part of their Outdoor Education curriculum. The camp will be held at Labrador MOE Outdoor Adventure Centre. Students can expect to take part in height-based activities, water activities and a navigation challenge as part of the programme. Students will be briefed on the camp preparation in the later part of January.

Total Defence Day 2025 (17 February 2025, as 15 February is a Saturday)

28 The theme of SG60 is "Building Our Singapore Together". This builds on the Forward Singapore exercise, in which Singaporeans affirmed their commitment to a renewed social compact. SG60 celebrates our nation-building journey and reflect on our shared values of multiculturalism, boldness, resilience and openness - values that have united us and enabled our prosperity against the odds over the past 60 years. It will also be an occasion to rally our students to *Connect* and *Contribute* through acts of *Care*.

As part of SG60, the focus for Total Defence Day 2025 "Together We Keep Singapore Strong", will highlight Singaporean's readiness and resilience in the face of crises and challenges. To encourage our students to develop and value this resilience, we will be participating in the Food Resilience Preparedness Programme (FRPP)* 2025. This experience raises students' awareness of Ready-to-Eat (RTE) meals as an alternative form of food and their role in the event of food crises. Through the shared experience of food disruption, students will have the opportunity to listen to others' stories, reflect on their own experiences of resilience and adaptability, and cultivate the *Will to Act* in order to *Contribute* positively to their lives and the community around them.

Communications

30 To support students in managing the use of mobile device, staff will use google classrooms to communicate with students. They are strongly encouraged not to use WhatsApp and will not be contacting students via mobile phone during curriculum hours.

Disclosure of staff mobile phone number is up to the individual staff discretion, and we seek your support to respect teachers' time by communicating during work hours, kept between 7.00am to 6.30pm (Monday to Friday) and 7.00am to 12.30pm (Saturday) except for urgent matters.

Safety and Security Related Matters

32 The school seeks the cooperation from all parents in ensuring the safety and security of our staff and students. We would like to remind parents/guardians on the following:

- a. <u>Visitor Declaration</u>. To enable the accounting of all visitors into the school compound, all visitors must register their particulars at the Security Guard Post. Do show our Security Guards any ID which can proof your identification. Upon clearance by the security guards, visitors <u>MUST</u> display the school visitor's sticker prominently on the upper right side of the shirt/blouse.
- b. <u>Car Decal.</u> To facilitate a smooth verification process to authorise vehicles on campus, you may apply for a CTSS Car Decal via this link <u>here</u>. Please do so by Tuesday 7 January 2025 and your child may collect the Car Decal from the General Office from 10 January 2025. Please note that:
 - i. <u>Decal Duration</u>. The issued Car Decal will be valid for the entire duration of your child's education at our school.
 - ii. <u>First-Time Issue</u>. The initial issuance of the Car Decal will be provided free of charge. If you need a replacement Car Decal due to loss, damage, or change of vehicle, a nominal replacement fee of \$5 will be charged to cover administrative and production cost.
 - iii. <u>Usage Restriction</u>. The Car Decal is exclusively intended for the purpose of drop-off and pick-up only. It is <u>not valid</u> for parking on school premise.
